When a child is removed from their parent, they become part of a system where their best interest may be overlooked and can change the story of their life. CASA of Terrebonne believes that every child should have a safe and nurturing home and have a voice in their own story. The courts provide a CASA who is a community volunteer trained in making the best recommendations to the judge while advocating for the foster child's best interest. The CASA monitors the child's educational, medical and social progress and voices the child's wants and needs in the courtroom.

Our Mission

The mission of Court Appointed Special Advocate of Terrebonne, Inc. is to be an independent and objective presence in the courts to speak for the best interests of abused and neglected children in foster care in Terrebonne Parish. CASA promotes and supports quality volunteer advocacy to help assure each child a safe, permanent and nurturing home.

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

What a difference a year makes! We are finally getting back to a sense of normalcy after experiencing the devastation of Hurricane Ida and the COVID virus in Terrebonne parish.

This year, we were able to increase our presence in the community and inform anyone who would listen about the important role CASA has in the lives of the children who are taken into State's custody in Terrebonne parish.

Even though we had to cancel our fall Pre-Service training class because of the hurricane, we did offer three classes and swore in 12 volunteers this fiscal year. That's what I call commitment in the face of chaos. National CASA not only requires 30 hours of Pre-Service training but advocates are also required to obtain 12 hours of continuing education. We do our best to find interesting and relevant topics to present to the volunteers in order to enhance their advocacy skills.

Being a CASA volunteer is not an ordinary volunteer assignment. The volunteers form lasting and positive relationships with the children they advocate for and often help to provide better future outcomes for these children. Besides the Annual Volunteer Appreciation social, the staff also offered events such as: "Boo the Volunteers" at Halloween and the "Cookie Exchange/ Reindeer Games" at Christmas time. We are convinced acknowledging and celebrating our volunteers throughout the year is essential to the retention and growth of our organization. We hope that our volunteers feel like they are not only a part of CASA's mission but that they are also a part of the CASA family.



We also would not exist and thrive without the support of organizations and individuals in the community who donate throughout the year (see the list of donors on page 15-16).

Organizations throughout the community also lend us support by donating food for training classes and appreciation events, Christmas gifts for the children we serve, air time for interviews and space to post flyers. This collaborative effort helps keep CASA financially sound and growing.

This year we also had a volunteer who was named Louisiana CASA of the Year. This well-deserved honor was bestowed upon Sarah Ghere at the CASA Conference held in Baton Rouge in April.

Volunteers are the backbone of CASA and we continue to applaud their commitment and efforts on behalf of the foster children we serve. Their kindness and dedication continues to inspire me to put forth my best to support them.








OPERATING REVENUE




OPERATING EXPENSES



Louisiana CASA's Advocate of the Year

Sarah Ghere

CASA of Terrebonne is proud to announce that our very own CASA volunteer, Sarah Ghere, was recognized as the Advocate of the Year by Louisiana CASA at the 2022 Awards of Excellence ceremony.

Sarah was CASA of Terrebonne's volunteer of the year for 2021 and had worked on two cases in the last few years. The first case was worked with her husband and ended in reunification. The second case was not so much a choice but a suggestion as a result of the circumstances. We the staff knew that if anyone could continue the support that the children needed, it would be this partnership. Although there was hesitation as a result of the age group, they agreed.

The staff and her Advocate Supervisor slowly saw a connection form although it took some time because these children had already been through two CASA volunteers. But that did not stop our duo from showing up and bribing them with food, because you know teenagers love food. Dropping off food soon became a conversation and then those conversations became advice and support for their future and immediate needs.

Although this case started as a duo, the partnership became one. Working on the case solo, Sarah questioned whether she has even made a difference, but we knew and saw the impact she was having. Sarah has been through so much with them from searching the streets when one ran away, to dealing

with the group home, the juvenile justice system, the sibling conflicts and being disliked when one had to take anger management classes for the second time. She stuck by them in those hard times and she was their number-one supporter.

Sarah's 17-year-old CASA child appreciates her coming to most of his football and basketball games. He states that she has always been there when he needed something and he appreciates her always asking about his needs.

Her 18-year-old CASA child stated that he appreciates her checking up on him and keeping in touch even after he aged out. He is very thankful to Sarah for coordinating and being there for his senior pictures but most of all for attending his graduation. He also appreciates how she gives them their space and allows them to talk about things they want to talk about. He felt comfortable talking to her about everything and he appreciated her trying to keep him on the right

track but most of all he thanked her for the ride during hurricane Ida when nobody else would.

We at CASA of Terrebonne want to also thank you, Sarah, for all of your hard work and dedication to these children. We know Gabby, their previous CASA, is looking down on us and she couldn't be any prouder of them and you for stepping up.
