MESSAGE FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DONNA M. BRUNET

New and exciting things are happening at CASA of Terrebonne. We have implemented a new program called the "Traveling Tutors". This program will place trained tutors with children in foster care who are lagging behind their peers in school and need that extra one-on-one help to get them to grade level. Nearly 70% of school-aged children in foster care have Individualized Education Plans (IEP's), only 50% will graduate from high school and less than 3% will graduate from college. Specialized tutoring for at-risk students can help them improve academically while preventing them from dropping out of school. We trained our first group of tutors on February 4 and will soon be placing them with a child in need of tutoring.



On the evening of **March 6**, in celebration of CASA's 20 year anniversary, we will be hosting "A Night for Children's Sake" at the home of Parish President Gordon Dove. There will be food from local vendors, an open bar, live music and both silent and live auctions. All proceeds will go to benefit CASA of Terrebonne and more importantly the children in foster care in Terrebonne Parish. Tickets are \$80/person and can be purchased on the CASA website. The public is invited so please let all your friends know.

TALKING TO CHILDREN ABOUT SAFETY

Safety and the CASA Child was developed to provide CASA Volunteer Advocates with an understanding of Safety Decision Making as it relates to the role of CASA in Child in Need of Care (CINC) cases. It is important for CASA Volunteer Advocates to connect their advocacy to child safety driven measures that improve safety outcomes for children and youth.
