Message from Executive Director, Donna M. Brunet

As we all celebrate Independence Day a/k/a the 4th of July, let's take the time to reflect on how lucky we are to live in a country where we are free and have choices.

We all remember the beginning of the second paragraph of the Declaration:

"WE hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness..."

Of course there is a lot more to it and everyone should really take the time to read it. Our forefathers had a way with words!

Here are a few fun facts about Independence Day:

• July 4, 1776 wasn't the day that the Continental Congress decided to declare independence -- they did that on July 2, 1776.

• It didn't become a federal holiday until 1870.

• There are 33 places in the United States with the word "liberty" in their names. Four of them are counties located in Georgia, Florida, Montana, and Texas.

• The Liberty Bell rings 13 times every Independence Day to honor the 13 original states. Descendants of people who signed the Declaration of Independence tap the bell, located in Philadelphia, PA, at 2 p.m. eastern time every 4th of July.

• The Pennsylvania Evening Post was the first newspaper to print the Declaration. It came out in the newspaper on July 6, 1776 for everyone to see, after a local printer named John Dunlap produced copies of the declaration's manuscript.

• Thomas Jefferson was the main author of the Declaration of Independence. Four others were also on the committee: Roger Sherman, Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, and Robert Livingston.

Carey has not only grown in her role as a CASA but she has also taken the time to educate our office about IEP's and has been very helpful in assisting us to be able to better advocate in the other cases we serve.

Carey will receive a polo shirt donated by Shelly Toups with Artistic Embroidery.


